



Bruce was the Marshall County King Agassiz in 1976 and was the impetus for the evolution from King Agassiz to the Emerging Leadership Program. Bruce told the audience about how an idea, when nurtured, can grow into a program with 35 years of history and 1147 alumni. Bruce and Aase were thanked for their continued support of the program.

The banquet program featured leadership stories by class participants, Eric Rice (Morris), Kristen Haase (Thief River Falls), and Justin Phillips (Rothsay). There was also the announcement of new Agassiz Ambassadors for 2020, Justin and Karen Phillips (Rothsay), who were selected for this honor from among other current participants in the program based on nominations from program participants and interviews with program alumni. Justin and Karen will put their leadership skills to work in public relations, recognition, and community leadership, and will work with Extension staff to develop and deliver the educational program in 2020.

The recognition banquet was the finale of the leadership program for the Class of 2019 after taking part in four training sessions since November 2018. Program seminars focused on several of the University of Minnesota Extension's educational program components to strengthen civic leadership in the region.


# North Dakota land values and rents show some strength

Cropland values and rents increased in parts of North Dakota in 2018.

North Dakota cropland value increased nearly 2 percent, according to a January survey the North Dakota Department of Trust Lands commissioned.

An earlier report from a June 2018 U.S. Department of Agriculture survey showed no change in North Dakota cropland values from the previous year.

"The January survey reflected the impact of very strong yields and federal aid to producers in the form of market facilitation payments to offset

the impact of Chinese tariffs on U.S. farm commodities," explains Andrew Swenson, North Dakota State University Extension farm management specialist.

"In 2018, North Dakota had a record spring wheat vield, and the second and third highest corn and soybean yields, respectively, on record," he says. "Market facilitation payments for the 2018 crop should be about \$400 million statewide, primarily on soybean production. There would have been downward pressure on land values in the absence of the extraordinary yields and government assistance to stabilize net farm income."

Swenson derived regional and state average cropland values and rents from the published results of the Department of Trust Lands' county-level survey.

The most recent county-level survey indicated that cropland values per acre from January 2018 to January 2019 were the strongest in the east-central region, increasing 13.5 percent (to \$2,248), and the northwestern region, increasing 7.2 percent (to \$1,189). The north-central and southern Red River Valley regions showed 3.7 and 2.9 percent increases to \$1,692 and \$4,064, respectively. The average increase was 1.2 percent in the northeastern region (to \$1,766).

Per-acre cropland values decreased 3 percent in the southeast and the northern Red River Valley regions to \$2,928 and \$2,768, respectively, and decreased about 2 percent in the south-central and southwestern regions, to \$1,610 and \$1,346, respectively.

The survey indicated that the average cash rent per acre for cropland increased by about 3.6 percent from January 2018 to January 2019, after a 4.6 percent decline the previous year. On average, rents remain slightly lower than two years earlier.

The greatest increases in cropland rent, around 10 percent, offset similar declines from the previous year in the south-central region (to \$56.80) and the northern Red River Valley region (to \$90.40). Increases of about 7 percent more than offset

declines of 5 percent from the previous year in the northwest (to \$37) and the southern Red River Valley (to \$125.90). Per-acre rents were flat to 1 percent higher in the northeast (\$56.70) and the east-central regions (to \$67.60), and 2 percent higher in the southeast (to \$96.70) and the southwestern regions (to \$37.80).

Swenson believes that the land market has shown resiliency in the aftermath of an 11-year period, from 2003 through 2013, during which cropland values averaged an annual increase of 15 percent. So far, land values have experienced a "soft-landing." The state experienced four years (2014 to 2017) of relatively modest declines in land values, despite much lower crop prices.

"Generally strong yields and modestly lower production costs tempered the decline," Swenson says.
"There were enough producers and investors who were willing and able to expand their operations and absorb the available land."

Very strong yields and government support helped underpin land values during 2018 despite low crop prices, and higher production costs and interest rates.

"The 2019 crop year looks to provide a challenge to farm profit and land values," Swenson says. "The low crop price scenario is expected to continue, production costs will be higher, and another infusion of government support is not likely.

"One positive is interest rates," he adds. "After increasing in 2018, the current outlook is stable rates for 2019."



# SCUL W. Birds, Cats, Dogs, Horses and Reptiles, Oh My! The Need for Animal Rescues

An obscene obsession with pets and an acute lack of responsibility created one of America's largest animal humane epidemics. Each year more than 6 million dogs and cats find their way into shelters, animal humane centers or are confiscated by animal control. More than half of these 6 million will be euthanized because no homes can be found for them.

Heather Clyde, Operations Director of Homeward Bound Animal Shelter in Fargo said, "Our largest issue is usually funding and space limitations. Last year, we took in over 1,100 animals, and caring for that many animals can get expensive. We also don't always have the space to house all the animals in need, so generally half of our animals are in foster homes at any given time."

In 2003, I returned from work to find my dog, Blitzy, leaping and jumping at something in the ditch outside our farmhouse. I was concerned it was a skunk but it was an orange and white striped kitten with a short tail. I later learned the breed of cat was a Bobtail. I know cat breeds and love cats so was very surprised to see a kitten barely off the mother's teat in a ditch ten miles from the nearest town and a mile from the nearest farm. A kitten does not drop from the sky! It is a common occurrence for farming *Continued on page 16*

families to have animals "dumped." We kept our little Bobtail and he became an important family member. He was neutered as all the rest of our pets. Not all animals are so lucky.

Many cats wander city streets or the countryside living on food left for them, rodents and small birds. Some even become prey to large birds, coyotes and cars.

Clyde explains that Homeward Bound created a novel approach for feral cats. "Our Barn Buddies program gives cats that are unsuitable for indoor living a second chance. These are cats that are 'feral' or lack socialization with people. They are often live-trapped and turned into the pound because they are unwanted where they are currently located. To prevent these cats from being euthanized at the pounds, we take them in, spay/ neuter and vaccinate them, and relocate them to farms, where they serve as rodent managers. Any farm home that can provide shelter and a food/water source for the cats can apply to receive a Barn Buddies cat(s) at no charge."

There are many reasons why animals are so abundant in the United States: people buy animals from pet centers or puppy mills desiring a cute baby animal to cuddle and love but their expectations don't match reality and they are not able to train their pet properly, become frustrated and decide to give the animal up. People do not have and keep responsibility for their pets. Pets are a lifetime commitment. Others do not spay or neuter animals which lead to more unwanted animals.

My mom's neighbor moved leaving their young Pomeranian chained to a tree in the back yard with no food or water. My mom looked after the dog for a few days but did not have the ability to keep it long term. I brought it to the farm, placed an ad on Craigslist, and found a loving, forever home for the young dog. We had a large dog and were not financially able to take on a little house dog.

I asked Charlotte Tuhy, co-owner of CJ's Pet Center, Hawley, MN, as well as co-owner of Hightail Ranch and Sanctuary east of Hawley, how people can feel that animals are disposable. "Oh boy, this is a big question, with as many possible answers as there are life situations. People get in over their heads, they do not always realize what expenses and time is involved in caring for their animals. They suffer from illnesses, depression, addictions, you name it, and all affect the whole family, including the pets. Sometimes I honestly think it is because they are looking for an animal to fulfill a deep down need that it cannot, and what they really need is self-acceptance and selflove. And our community doesn't do a lot to support people who are struggling. If you have kids and you cannot take care of them there are many agencies who will help, but not so with your pets."

Pets created \$72.56 billion in spending in 2018 according to the American Pet Products Association (APPA) an organization that tracks the industry. That number is broken down by products used:

Food was 30.32 billion, supplies and over-the-counter meds was 16.01 billion, vet care was 18.11

billion, live animal purchases was 2.01 billion and other services amounted to 6.11 billion.

According to the Animal Humane Society more than 3500 animal shelters exist in the USA and more than 10,000 rescue groups are in North America.

We've all seen the television commercials pleading for monetary donations to save innocent cats, dogs, bunnies, snakes, birds, and every imaginable animal that someone has taken into their homes and later discarded. The ads tug at our heartstrings and plead for funding to continue their mission. It is a societal epidemic with no expectation for change.

On a larger scale, unwanted horse numbers have been increasing since horse slaughter was outlawed in the United States in 2007. Unwanted equine rescues exist in every state, same problem on a larger scale. The American Society for the Protection of Animals (ASPCA) indicates that more than 80,000 unwanted horses annually are shipped to slaughterhouses in Canada and Mexico.



Unwanted horses, especially those captured and housed by the Bureau of Land Management in the American West, are a very controversial topic in the horse industry. Horse advocates cite BLM mismanagement, abuse, corruption, and misinformation in the manner in which wild horses are managed.

According to a study commissioned by the ASPCA in 2017, horses relinquished to rescue organizations for health reasons were 54 percent, for lack of suitability for desired purpose were 28 percent, and for behavioral problems of the horses were 28 percent. Horses are prey animals that typically live in herds for mutual protection and

socialization. People wanting to own and work with horses need to know and understand herd mentality and be able train a horse to respect them as leader.

The American Horse Council surveys American horse persons, like a census, and provides these economic impact facts from their 2017 National Economic Impact Study:

"The horse industry contributes approximately \$50 billion in direct economic impact to the U.S. economy, and has a direct employment impact of 988,394 jobs. Additionally, the industry itself contributes \$38 billion in direct wages, salaries, and benefits

"From those direct effects, the horse industry's contribution ripples out into other sectors of the economy. When one adds these ripple effects the estimated result of the total contribution of the horse industry to the U.S. economy is \$122 billion, and a total employment impact of 1.7 million jobs.

Some key industry statistics and economic indicators: there are an estimated 7.2 million horses in the USA broken down by the following activities: Recreation: 3,141,449; Showing: 1,227,986; Racing: 1,224,482; Working: 537,261."

In addition to cats, dogs and horses, many other critters need rescues. At this time of the year rescue organizations will see bunnies, given for the Easter holiday and not wanted when the surprise wears off. Reptiles are commonly discarded as are birds, chickens, and even pigs, according to Kish Hilmert, President and founder of 4 Luv of Dog Rescue and KPA-Certified Training Partner at Down Dog

"Educating people and families on the importance of spay and neuter is one of the main ways to reduce the huge animal overpopulation problem," Kish advises. "Also leading by example is important. So having our own personal pets spayed and neutered, showing them kindness and respect through force free, stress free positive reinforcement training and interaction is important. Also educating people on all the responsibilities that come along with a pet so they understand what they are signing up for when they adopt is another important education aspect of rescue and being a companion animal guardian."

Birds, in particular, suffer horrific cruelty during the process of capture and transport to market. In Malaysia, birds are cap-



tured by liming, or coating a branch with a sticky substance and waiting for a bird to perch. Mist nets are spread across flight

paths to capture exotic birds which are often left to hang for prolonged periods resulting in slow agonizing deaths. Some bird species

are endangered as a result of the bird trade. The Wild-Caught Bird Act (WBCA) in 1993 placed an embargo on the import of all exotic or endangered feathered species into the USA except under tightly regulated circumstances.

Many people have very strong feelings about how the animals, large and small, are cared for which can lead to conflicts within the rescue organizations. Should cats, dogs, or horses be housed or allowed to live in natural environments?

"I guess I would like to know who put them in charge of deciding what makes the animals happy and comfortable," comments Tuhy. "One of my favorite veterinarians told me once that when you are trying to decide what is best for your animal, take a good hard look at what their wild counterparts are doing, and set up your animal keeping as close to that as you can, within reason. He would wink, and say, we call this "God's Plan",

the way they were created to be before we came along and mucked it all up. So, taking his statement to heart, our horses should be outdoors where they can run, play, and exercise and eat when they feel the need. They should be able to go somewhere to get out of the wind when they need to. Dogs and cats need exercise and fresh air also. Now we have bred winter coats out of many of them (though not all) so we have to accommodate their need to be warm and dry. Even our outdoor dogs should have a den of sorts i.e. a warm, dry shelter. And our dogs and cats need REAL FOOD! They were created to eat meat, and even do some grazing on veggies and fruits and such. We need to stop with the completely processed kibble often made out of things we wouldn't consider eating."

# Looking Back on Nutrition and Other Trends in the Last 40 Years

Though nutrition recommendations have changed over the years, moderation is still key

### Where were you in 1979?

I know some of my readers were adults at the time; others were teens or children. Others weren't born

We recently celebrated the 40th birthday of the North Dakota Nutrition Council at the annual conference. Our keynote speaker, Judi Adams, who retired from the Wheat Foods Council, walked us through decades of changes in nutrition recommendations.

Trust me: Much has changed in the last four

decades in popular culture, daily conveniences and nutrition recommendations.

People had only a few TV channels to choose from in 1979. "Mork and Mindy," "Happy Days," "Laverne and Shirley," "Little House on the Prairie," "Dallas" and "The Love Boat" were among the most popular

programs. Do you remember rabbit ears and aluminum foil?

Of course, cellphones weren't in everyone's hands. In 1979, we were lucky if we had a long phone cord on the only phone in the house.

You couldn't take a photo with your phone and upload it to Facebook to share with your friends immediately. You had to send film away to be developed, and you hoped people had their eyes open in the photos when you received the prints in the mail.

The Sony Walkman was introduced in 1979 with a hefty price tag for the time: \$150. We didn't have ear buds and YouTube.

Most people were wearing a lot of polyester back 40 years ago. Men, did you have a leisure suit or two? Oh, admit it. Your dad and grandpa probably did, anyway. Those polyester knit clothes probably look as good as new if you found them in a closet today.

In 1979, "Superman the Movie" was launched, along with "Rocky II," the "Muppet Movie" and "Star Trek: The Motion Picture." The Bee Gees, Rod Stewart, Blondie, Gloria Gaynor and Michael Jackson were popular.

### Time flies, doesn't it?

What about food and nutrition? In 1979, nutrition experts were gearing up to launch the first U.S. Dietary

Guidelines for Americans in 1980

We certainly weren't ordering "Uber Eats" with an app on our cellphone. Eating out was a big treat for most families four decades ago, and coffee houses did not dot the landscape of urban America, beckoning us with caloric lattes and mochas.

Special "kid food" didn't emerge until McDonald's Happy Meals were introduced in 1979. Of course, we weren't taking pictures of our restaurant meal and Snap-chatting or Tweeting it to our friends.

Restaurant portions were much smaller in 1979, too. Most people were smaller as well. Despite smaller waistlines, fad diets were popular then, as they are now. In 1979, the Atkins diet was popular, as was the Scarsdale diet. Neither gets two thumbs up from nutrition experts, then or now.

Back then, nutrition research pointed toward recommending low-fat diets. Now our messages point to choosing healthful fats, not necessarily fatfree foods. Eating less salt was a focus in 1979, and it remains as a focus in 2019.

Carbs were considered "bad" by some in 1979, and some people shun carbs today, too. However, people who eat low-carb diets may be lacking in several vitamins and minerals, and their diet choices may have adverse effects on their heart, muscles, kidneys and other organs.

Forty years ago, eggs were on the "bad" list due to their cholesterol content. More recently, cholesterol restrictions were removed, and now nutrition experts are debating the best level of dietary cholesterol that is healthful.

# Moderation is the key for most things.

Many things have changed, but some things have stayed the same. We in nutrition still are trying to get everyone to eat more fruits and vegetables because 90 percent of adults shortchange themselves on the recommendation (4 1/2 cups fruits and vegetables daily).

If you are looking for a healthful diet to follow, remember two diets: The Mediterranean diet and DASH (Dietary Approaches to Stop Hypertension) diet are considered among the top diets that promote health today.

These are the key messages from the most recent national nutrition guidance available at https://www.choosemyplate.gov/. Which ones do you achieve on most days?

- Make half your plate fruits and vegetables: vary your veggies and focus on whole fruits.
- Make half your grains whole grains.
- Vary your protein routine. Make onefourth of your plate protein.
- Move to low-fat or fat-free milk or yogurt.
- Drink water instead of sugary drinks.

The other morning, I listened to radio announcers talking about a food trend from the last several years: meals in a bowl. I'm not talking about soup.

A meal in a bowl consists of layers of ingredients, which you can set up as a "create your own meal" buffet with several options for a family gathering. Instead of a recipe, we will get a little creative this week with some basics from an NDSU Extension handout. For a printable copy, see www.ag.ndsu.edu/pubs/yf/foods/fn1757.pdf.

### 5 Steps to Making Your Own Meal in a Bowl

Choose one grain. Add 1/2 cup of your favorite grain, such as cooked brown rice, quinoa, wild rice or whole-grain pasta.

Choose one or more vegetables. For example, add 1/2 cup of veggies, such as a mixture of chopped bell peppers, onions, tomatoes, spinach, carrots or mushrooms.


Add some fruit. For example, add 1/2 cup of chopped apples, peaches or mandarin oranges.

Choose one or more proteins. Add about 2 ounces of protein to your creation, such as cooked lean ground beef, lean ham, chopped roasted chicken or black beans, or another of your favorite protein foods.

Choose one or more sauces or seasonings. Try teriyaki or sweet and sour sauce for an Asian-inspired bowl,

or taco sauce or salsa for a Mexican-inspired bowl.



# **Older Americans Month 2019**

Every May, the Administration for Community Living leads our nation's observance of Older Americans Month. The 2019 theme, Connect, Create, Contribute, encourages older adults and their communities to: Connect with friends, family, and services that support participation. Create by engaging in activities that promote learning, health, and personal enrichment. Contribute time, talent, and life experience to benefit others.

Communities that encourage the contributions of older adults are stronger! By engaging and supporting all community members, we recognize that older adults play a key role in the vitality of our neighborhoods, networks, and lives.

Each year the Land of the Dancing Sky Area Agency on Aging looks forward to recognizing our older Americans by providing them with creative programs that are not only educational but fun. Here are a few classes you need to know about.

Many older adults experience a fear of falling. People who develop this fear often limit their activities, which can result in physical weakness, making the risk of falling even greater.

Matter of Balance is a program designed to reduce the fear of falling and increase activity levels among older adults. This class includes eight two-hour sessions for a small group led by a trained facilitator. The Chronic Disease Self-Management Program is a workshop given two and a half hours, once a week, for six weeks, in community settings such as senior centers, churches, libraries and hospitals. People with different chronic health problems attend together. Workshops are facilitated by two trained leaders, one or both of whom are non-health professionals with chronic diseases themselves.

Powerful Tools for Caregivers consists of six weekly classes where caregivers develop a wealth of self-care tools to: reduce personal stress; change negative self-talk; communicate their needs to family members and healthcare or service providers; communicate more effectively in challenging situations; recognize the messages in their emotions, deal with difficult feelings; and make tough caregiving decisions. Class participants also receive a copy of The Caregiver Helpbook, developed specifically for the class.

Tai Ji Quan: Moving for Better Balance (TJQMBB) is a research-based balance training regimen designed for older






